# Birding for a cause

The Great Wisconsin Birdathon is April 15th-June 15th

[ACROSS WISCONSIN – April 15th, 2023] Birders are "gathering their flocks" for NRF's Great Wisconsin Birdathon, the state's largest fundraiser for bird conservation.

The Birdathon is like a walk-a-thon-style fundraiser, but instead of logging miles, teams log bird sightings. Teams choose their own birding adventure and participate in a wide variety of ways. Some go birding for a couple of hours in their own backyard, while some travel to a birding hotspot and count as many species as they can for a full 24 hours! The Birdathon is for everybody – people of all birding skill levels are encouraged to participate.

What: NRF's Great Wisconsin Birdathon

**When:** Teams can register now and go birding anytime April 15<sup>th</sup> -June 15<sup>th</sup> (the peak of spring bird migration)

Where: Anywhere in Wisconsin

**Who:** Birders from all across the state participate in this event, which is coordinated by the <u>Natural Resources</u> Foundation of <u>Wisconsin</u>

**Why:** Each year, the Birdathon raises over \$100,000 for Wisconsin's highest priority bird conservation projects via The Natural Resources Foundation of Wisconsin's Bird Protection Fund. Last year, funds raised by participants supported creating piping plover habitat, rearing whooping crane chicks, spreading awareness about Connecticut warblers, supporting community initiatives for bird-friendly neighborhoods, engaging new and underrepresented voices in the birding community, building impactful collaborations to protect Wisconsin's Important Bird Areas, and protecting our neotropical migrants on their long migratory journeys to Central America.
